March 12 thru 14: EIOS attended the North Eastern Wisconsin Orchid Show (NEWOS) in Neenah, Wisconsin. Andy Coghill was show chairman. He, Nile, and Lois Dusdieker setup a 50' display using 50 plants from 9 society members. Twenty nine ribbons later, including first place

for the display and Best of Class for all orchid society displays, a vase was awarded to Nile and Lois' Ctt. Golddigger 'Buttercup' for best specimen plant of the show. A great Friday night 'Fish fry' and Sunday Brunch at the hotel were added benefits. Photos of the display and some member's plants are shown here.

March 19 thru 21: EIOS went to the Greater Omaha Orchid Show (GOOS) at the Laurenzen Gardens Botanical Center. Jon and Joan Lorence were show chairpersons. Nile had to get the tape measure out as our usual 50' display was a bit askew (6 by 8+ feet). With floor lighting the result was dazzling. The show was likewise impressive with lots of vendors and real quality flowers! Fifty three plants from 9 members garnered 33 ribbons including two special awards and MORE! Old reliable Ctt Golddigger got best Cattleye Alliance of the show with a nice plague. Koch's Paph. Harrisonianum got another 1st place ribbon (it has been to 5 shows this season with three 1st s and one 2nd place ribbon — tough durable plant!).

NOW FOR THE BEST PART: As we all know, Jon Lorence grows magnificent *Phragmipediums*. He brought 3 massive **loooong** petalled Phrag. hybrids and all three were taken back for AOS judging. Phrag. Wossner Supergrande (*warscewiczianum x longifolium*) was awarded an AWARD OF MERIT (**AM/AOS**) showing a

deep, rich, burnt orange brown color. Jon named it in honor of his mother. Then Phrag. Devil Fire (Grande x warscewiczianum) was also awarded an AWARD OF MERIT. Jon named that for his wife, Joan - Phrag. Devil Fire 'Joan' AM/AOS – we won't take that any further except to say CONGRATS! The third one, Phrag. Giganteum (caudatum x longifolium) was actually the largest flower of the group, but the judges thought the coloring was a bit pale. That hybrid was first made in 1894 nd early parents may actually have been a diffearent or darker species so the critique was a bit unfair. The Mid-America Orchid Congress, Fox Valley Plaque for best Cypripedium Alliance of the show was given to the two awarded plants.

MARCH MADDNESS CONTINUES with the ILLOWA show 3/26-28. At the time of this writing I think we will have a very nice variety of plants for the display; more on that at the April meeting.
